## MAKE STRONG PASSWORDS

Your passwords are your first line of defense in Internet security. Here's how to make them really strong:

Start with a word or short phrase that's not common and means something to you. Make it at least 10 characters long. This will be your base password. For example:

Push the two words together and substitute symbols, numbers, and uppercase letters, using them consistently, like this:

M!DD1e3ch\*\*1
